 “Chapter 8, Of Christ the Mediator,” part 6
 September 3, 2017

- Paragraph 6: The Application of Christ’s Work before His Incarnation
 - Some forms of Dispensationalism teach that Christ’s work didn’t apply during the time of the Old Covenant.
 - Scriptural Proof: Gen 3:15; Rom 4:1-12; Heb 11:4, 7, 26; Rev 13:8.
- Paragraph 7: Understanding how the Bible Speaks of Christ
 - “Christ in the work of mediation, acts according to both natures, by each doing that which is proper to itself.”
 - “Yet by reason of the unity of the person, that which is proper to one nature is sometimes in Scripture, attributed to the person denominated by the other nature.”
 - Scriptural Proofs: Acts 20:28; 1 Corinthians 2:8
- Paragraph 9: The Exclusivity of Christ’s Mediation
 - This paragraph is directed primarily at Roman Catholicism, which teaches that there are human priests who mediate between God and men.
 - Scriptural proof: 1 Tim 5:9.
- Chapter 10: The Three Mediatorial Offices of Christ
 - Prophet: What is a prophet?
 - Scriptural proofs: Deut 18:15-18 (Acts 3:22-23); Matt 11:25-27; Lk 13:33 (Jesus refers to Himself as a prophet) John 1:18.
 - Application.

 - What is the difference between a prophet and a priest?
 - Scriptural proofs: Zech 6:12-13 (OT reference); Heb 5:14; 7:23-27
 - Application.
 - King: What is a king?

- Scriptural proofs: Heb 1:8-13; Lk 1:26-33; Psalm 110:1-3; 1 Cor 15:25-27.
