2Ti 1:6 Therefore I remind you to stir up the gift of God which is in you through the laying on of my hands.

In recent lessons we have considered how the enemy of our souls will seek to mire us down with our past or fill us with fear of the future. This lesson focuses upon a method that he uses ever so subversively to lead us from the will of God. Our feelings are a gift from the Lord, but they cannot be the leader of our souls. Like all other tools, they must be kept in their place, under submission to the Word of God. We are going to consider how feelings can mislead us and deceive us and then point to a certain cure in making sure that we are following the Word of God and not our fickle feelings.
